Workshop notes for Hampden Park Charity quilt:

Cut two squares from your feature fabric - suggest $121 / 2 \prime$ - and your background fabric; layer one of each right sides together and on the back of the paler fabric draw the diagonal line; sew a seam allowance (approx $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ or slightly smaller) either side of this; cut up along the drawn line; press seams to the darker fabric - square up to a size - say $12^{\prime \prime}$ or $113 / 4^{\prime \prime}$.

Repeat for the other pair of fabrics.

Lay out the four large half-square triangle into a diamond shape; sew together as a simple 4-patch.

Measure across to give you the length for the $1^{\text {st }}$ border:
Cut a strip of fabric the width of border that you want- say $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ (which will give you approx $3^{\prime \prime}$ finished border) - and then subcut to the length you have just measured; you will need 2 pieces this length.

Sew a border strip onto one edge; repeat with the opposite side of the square.

Press borders open and then remeasure to give you the length for the final 2 pieces of the $1^{\text {st }}$ border.

Measure; you are planning to make this quilt up to 40 " square - so you can calculate the width needed or the $2^{\text {nd }}$ border (remember that you need to take off $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ from the measurement to give you the finished size of your quilt!).

Add $2^{\text {nd }}$ border in the same way that you did the first - and there you have it!!! SIMPLES!

Layer, quilt - quickly and simply - and bind and send off to Ann Hill by $31^{\text {st }}$ May
