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## Fabric Requirements

SKU	Description	Quantity	Cutting Instructions
1914 T	Cats	25cm / 1/3 yd	8 x 2 3/4" squares 8 x (2 3/4" x 7 1/4" rectangles)
1915 Y (incl 4m backing)	Garden	4.25m / 4 2/3 yd	1 x 5 1/2" square 4 x 3" squares 8 x 1 3/4" squares
1916 B	Floral	50cm / 5/8 yd	Cut 4 x 4 1/2" strips WOF and subcut into: 30 x 4 1/2" squares. Using template A cut out 30 quarter circles from the 4 1/2" squares
1917 G	Scatter	75cm / 7/8 yd	Cut 10 x 2 1/2" strips WOF and subcut 4 of these as follows: 2 x (2 1/2" x 37") and 2 x (2 1/2" x 41") Join the remaining 6 strips end to end and subcut as follows: 2 x (2 1/2" x 54 1/2") and 2 x (2 1/2" x 58 1/2") Cut 1 x 2 3/4" strip WOF and subcut into 4 x 2 3/4" squares.
1917 P	Scatter	50cm / 5/8 yd	Cut 4 x 4 1/2" strips WOF and subcut into: 30 x 4 1/2" squares and then using template A, cut 30 quarter circles from the 4 1/2" squares. Cut 1 x 1 3/4" strip WOF (44"/112cm) and subcut into: 4 x (1 3/4" x 3") and 8 x 1 3/4" squares
1918 P8	Outline	25cm / 1/3 yd	Cut 3 x 2 3/4" strips WOF. Do not subcut
1918 T	Outline	50cm / 5/8 yd	Cut 6 x 2 3/4" strips WOF. Do not subcut
1919 T	Paws	25cm / 1/3 yd	4 x (1 3/4" x 3")
1920 W	Chalk Stripe	50cm / 5/8 yd	7 x 2 1/2" strips WOF.
1921 1	Panel	60cms / 2/3 yd	
2000 W01	Spectrum	1.25m / 1 3/8 yds	Cut 4 x 1 3/4" strips WOF. Subcut these strips as follows: 6 x (1 3/4" x 10 1/2") 2 x (1 3/4" x 33") Cut 1 x 1 1/2" strip WOF. Subcut this strip as follows: 4 x (1 1/2" x 5") 4 x (1 1/2" x 10 1/2") Cut 5 x 2 1/2" strips WOF. Subcut these as follows: 2 x (2 1/2" x 33") 2 x (2 1/2" x 37") 4 x (2 1/2" x 8 1/2") Cut 9 x 2 3/4" strips WOF. Do not subcut. Cut 4 x 4 1/2" strips WOF. Using template B cut out 60 background fans from these strips
	Wadding	1.75m / 1 7/8 yds (minimum 178 cm / 70" wide)	
Other	Basting Spray 505, 2 x 4 1/2" squares of template plastic		

## Notes:

- Read the pattern in full before starting.
- Scant  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seams are used throughout except where stated otherwise.
- Press after each seam, pressing seams open or to one side as preferred.
- WOF = width of fabric – a strip of fabric cut from selvedge to selvedge or from the selvedge to the centre cut if cutting FQs.
- Take care when piecing directional fabrics
- Trace templates onto template plastic and cut out.

## Sewing Instructions

### **Make the centre block:**

1. Join pairs of  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x 3" 1917-P and 1919-T rectangles right sides together along the long edge. Press.
2. Join pairs of  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " 1917-P and 1915-Y squares right sides together. Press.
3. Join the  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " pairs either side of the rectangle pairs. Make 4. Press.
4. Assemble and sew row 1 right sides together. Press.
5. Assemble and sew row 2 right sides together. Press.
6. Assemble and sew row 3 right sides together. Press.
7. Sew the rows right sides together taking care to butt/nest the intersecting seams. Press. Block should measure  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " square.



### **Make the centre panel:**

1. Cut out all sections of the panel leaving a scant  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance around all shapes. There are 4 x  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " squares, 8 x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and 4 x ( $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " ) rectangles.
2. Sew a  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strip between pairs of the smallest squares. Press. Join these to the top of a rectangle picture using a  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " strip. Make 4.
3. To make rows 1 and 3 join 3 squares using  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " strips between each square. To make row 2 sew  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " strips either side of the centre block. Press. Join the remaining pictures either side of these strips. Press.
4. Sew  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " strips to the top and bottom of row 2. Press
5. Join rows 1 and 3 to the top and bottom of these strips. Press.
6. Sew  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 33" white strips to the sides. Press before attaching  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 37" white strips to the top and bottom. Press.
7. Attach the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 37" side borders of 1917-G. Press. Add the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 41" top and bottom borders of 1917-G. Press. Centre panel should measure 41" square.




### **Make the checkerboard sides (4):**

1. Join a white  $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x wof strip either side of each 1918-P8 strip (set 1). Press
2. Join a  $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x wof 1918-T strip either side of a white strip (set 2). Press
3. Subcut these sets into  $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x  $7\frac{1}{4}$ " units (36 for set 1 and 36 for set 2).
4. Join alternating sets right sides together until there are 18 units in each border. Press.
5. Join 2 checkboards to each side of the panel. Press. Fig 14



### Make the Cornerstones (4):

1. Join 1914-T squares either side of a 1915-Y square. Press.
2. To these attach 1914-T rectangles to the top and bottom edges. Press.
3. Attach cornerstones to each short end of the remaining 2 checkboards. Press.
4. Attach these to the top and bottom of the panel. Press.
5. Attach the 2½" x 54½" side borders of 1917-G. Press. Add the 2½" x 58½" top and bottom borders of 1917-G. Press. Quilt top should now measure 58½" square.



### Make the Drunkard's Path Units (60):

1. Place a Background Fan and Quarter Circle on the table, right side up. Fig 1
2. Flip the Quarter Circle over so that the fabrics are right sides together and aligned at the top edge. Fig 2
3. Carefully take the fabrics to the machine. Sew a few stitches at the top to anchor.
4. Align and anchor the bottom edges with a pin.
5. Lift up the quarter circle and straighten the background fan (do not stretch them).
6. Start sewing slowly, keeping the quarter circle up and making sure the edges of the 2 fabrics meet as you sew the ¼" (6mm) seam.
7. Get as close to the bottom edge as you can without stretching the fabric. With the needle down in the fabric, lift up the presser foot and straighten the remaining fabric. Put the presser foot down and continue sewing to the end (do not remove the pin until you have finished).
8. Press the seam towards the darkest fabric. The unit should measure 4½".
9. Join 14 pairs of matching units together (in each colourway) making sure to match the points where the curves meet. Press the seams open. Fig 3
10. Make the side borders (2): Join sets of drunkards paths together as shown in cover picture, with a 2½" white strip between each group of 6 drunkards paths. Press.
11. Attach the side borders. Press.
12. Make the top and bottom borders (2): Join sets of drunkards paths together as shown in cover picture, with a 2½" white strip between each group of 8 drunkards paths. Press.







### Basting/Quilting/Binding:

1. Bring the short ends of the backing right sides together and separate at the fold. Join the 2 pieces together along the long edge making sure the direction of the prints are the same. Press the seam open.
2. Spray baste the quilt top, wadding and backing together and quilt as desired.
3. Trim off any excess wadding and backing and square up the quilt if necessary.
4. Join the binding strips together, end to end and iron in half widthways, wrong sides together. Attach to the quilt following the double fold method.

Check printer settings are set to "actual size" if scale box is incorrect.











